Dear Sirs

We act for John Michael Chapman, Andrew Christopher Chapman and David Alan Leeming, the registered proprietors of land registered under Title Number ("Owners"). We have been instructed on their behalf to object to a Notice of an Application for an Order to Acquire Land/Rights in Land Compulsorily, to Use Land, for Powers to Carry Out Protective Works to Buildings, and to Extinguish Right Over the Land. A copy of the said notice is attached.

The grounds for the objection are as follows:-

- 1. The Owners are currently negotiating a Promotion Agreement in respect of the Property. The agreement anticipates a planning application being made for residential development by a developer. Whilst the agreement has not been exchanged, it has already been fairly heavily negotiated, and it is hoped that agreement will be reached soon. Once it has been, the developer will under terms of the Promotion Agreement make an application for planning permission and that land could well include the land which is subject to the order. The precise scheme for development of the Property is not yet known, but there is a danger that the order could have the effect of sterilising or adversely affect the proposed development.
- 2. Part of the Property is used by users of allotment gardens situated on the north side of the railway track off Barwick Road. This could be interfered with by the plans for the Property. Access is over the land coloured brown on the attached plan marked "Network Rail licence plan (Garforth Allotments.)" The arrangement was put in place following closure of a nearby level crossing.
- 3. Network Rail also have a licence to occupy the land shown on the attached plan which is marked "Network Rail licence plan (Garforth Allotments)". Network Rail contacted the Owners approximately 2 years ago to formalise this arrangement. However, since contacting the Owner, no serious attempt has been made by Network Rail to complete agreement. The Owner's agent has made several attempts to make progress but attempts of contact have been unsuccessful. The contact at Network rail is James Holroyd, based at Toft Green in York. Various correspondence sent by my client's agent have been ignored. In addition, there is a licence fee due under the licence to occupy which is in arrears.

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

NOTICE OF AN APPLICATION FOR AN ORDER TO ACQUIRE LAND/RIGHTS IN LAND COMPULSORILY, TO USE LAND, FOR POWERS TO CARRY OUT PROTECTIVE WORKS TO BUILDINGS AND TO EXTINGUISH RIGHTS OVER LAND

To: Andrew Christopher Chapman,

Network Rail Infrastructure Limited ("Network Rail") of Waterloo General Office, London SE1 8SW has applied to the Secretary of State for Transport under section 6 of the Transport and Works Act 1992. The draft Order makes provision for the following:

- (a) authorisation to construct, enhance, operate and maintain works on the Transpennine Line between Leeds and Micklefield for the purposes of increasing capacity and improving journey time and performance reliability of rail services on the Transpennine Line between York, Leeds and Manchester, including works to facilitate the upgrade of the existing railway, railway electrification works and associated works between Leeds and Micklefield;
- the demolition and reconstruction and construction of overbridges and highways on the Transpennine Line between Leeds and Micklefield;
- powers to compulsorily acquire interests in and rights over land, extinguish rights over land and to use land temporarily for the purposes of the works authorised by the Order and associated works;
- (d) the disapplication of legislative provisions and provision regarding the application of local railway enactments and the application of existing agreements;
- (e) powers to execute street works, temporarily and permanently stop up and/or divert, footpaths and highways, alter the layout of streets, provide access to works, make traffic regulations and provisions relating to streets. The Order also makes provision for the closure of level and accommodation crossings; and
- (f) powers relating to the operation and use of the railway, a defence to proceedings in respect of statutory nuisance, the felling or lopping of trees overhanging the proposed works and the prevention of obstruction of the construction of works and ancillary provisions.

The application contains a statement that a direction for deemed planning permission is being applied for. The application is not to be made subject to an environmental impact assessment.

The draft order provides for the compulsory purchase of land and new rights, right to use land, for powers to carry out protective works to buildings, and extinguishment of rights in and over land, described in the Schedule below, in which it is believed you have an interest.

An objection or other representation MUST:

- (iii) state the grounds of the objection or other representation;
- (iv) indicate who is making the objection or other representation; and
- (v) give an address to which correspondence relating to the objection or other representation may be sent (if you are sending your objection or representation by e-mail please provide a postal address).

Where an objection is made (and not withdrawn) by a person who is an owner, lessee, tenant or occupier of any land which is subject to compulsory purchase in the draft order, and that person so requests in writing, the Secretary of State must hold a public inquiry or otherwise give the person an opportunity to be heard. However, this rule will not apply where the objection appears to the Secretary of State to be frivolous or trivial, or to relate to matters which fall to be determined by a tribunal concerned with the assessment of compensation.

The Secretary of State may make complete copies of the objections and other representations public, including any personal information contained in them, and will copy them to the applicant for the order.
